

PROFESSOR BRUCE HOFFMAN

Professor Bruce Hoffman has been studying terrorism and insurgency for nearly forty years. He is currently the Director of the Center for Security Studies and the Security Studies Program at Georgetown University's Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service. Professor Hoffman previously held the Corporate Chair in Counterterrorism and Counterinsurgency at the RAND Corporation and was also Director of RAND's Washington, D.C. Office. He was Scholar-in-Residence for Counterterrorism at the Central Intelligence Agency between 2004-2006; an adviser on counterterrorism to the Office of National Security Affairs, Coalition Provisional Authority, Baghdad, Iraq in 2004 and from 2004-2005 an adviser on counterinsurgency to the Strategy, Plans, and Analysis Office at Multi-National Forces-Iraq Headquarters, Baghdad. Professor Hoffman is the author of *Inside Terrorism* (Columbia Univ. Press, 1998 & 2006). His latest books are *Anonymous Soldiers: Terrorism and Counterterrorism in Palestine and the Rise of Israel* (Knopf) and *Leader-led Jihad: The Evolution of the Global Terrorist Threat From 9/11 to Osama bin Laden's Death* (Columbia Univ. Press), which will both appear in 2014.
