**COMMITTEE ACTION**

The Committee on Homeland Security met, pursuant to notice, in open markup session, a quorum being present, on Wednesday, December 9, 2009, in 311 Cannon House Office Building to consider H. Res. 922, Committee Resolution 3, and Committee Resolution 4. The Committee took the following actions:

H. Res. 922, Directing the Secretary of Homeland Security to transmit to the House of Representatives all information in the possession of the Department of Homeland Security relating to the Department's planning, information sharing, and coordination with any state or locality receiving detainees held at Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba on or after January 20, 2009; was ordered to be reported to the House, as amended, with a favorable recommendation by voice vote.
