

**AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
TO H.R. 4383
OFFERED BY MS. LORETTA SANCHEZ OF
CALIFORNIA**

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the “DHS Human Traf-
3 ficking Prevention Act of 2016”.

**4 SEC. 2. ENHANCED DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY
5 COORDINATION.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
7 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Home-
8 land Security shall issue Department of Homeland Secu-
9 rity-wide directive to personnel that includes guidance on
10 the following:

11 (1) Types of information that should be col-
12 lected and recorded in information technology sys-
13 tems utilized by the Department to help identify in-
14 dividuals suspected or convicted of human traf-
15 ficking.

16 (2) How to ensure data reliability of informa-
17 tion regarding individuals suspected or convicted of

1 human trafficking recorded in information tech-
2 nology systems utilized by the Department.

3 (3) Systematic and routine information sharing
4 regarding individuals suspected or convicted of
5 human trafficking within and among the components
6 of the Department.

7 (b) INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SYSTEMS.—Not
8 later than one year after the date of the enactment of this
9 Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall ensure that,
10 consistent with the Department of Homeland Security-
11 wide directive required under subsection (a), information
12 technology systems utilized within the Department to
13 record and track information regarding individuals sus-
14 pected or convicted of human trafficking are integrated
15 with each other.

16 (c) OVERSIGHT.—Not later than 18 months after the
17 date of the enactment of this Act, the Inspector General
18 of the Department of Homeland Security shall report to
19 the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of
20 Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security
21 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate on the status of
22 implementation of this section.

23 (d) HUMAN TRAFFICKING DEFINED.—The term
24 “human trafficking” means an act or practice described

1 in paragraph (9) or (10) of section 103 of the Trafficking
2 Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22 U.S.C. 7102).
