 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "DHS Acquisition Doc-
- 5 umentation Integrity Act of 2016".

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SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY ACQUISI TION DOCUMENTATION.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title VII of the Homeland Secu4 rity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 341 et seq.) is amended by
5 adding at the end the following:

6 "SEC. 708. ACQUISITION DOCUMENTATION.

7 "(a) IN GENERAL.—For each major acquisition pro8 gram, the Secretary, acting through the Under Secretary
9 for Management, shall require the head of a relevant com10 ponent or office to—

11	"(1) maintain acquisition documentation that is
12	complete, accurate, timely, and valid and that in-
13	cludes, at a minimum—

14 "(A) operational requirements that are
15 validated consistent with Departmental policy
16 and changes to those requirements, as appro17 priate;

18 "(B) a complete life-cycle-cost estimate19 with supporting documentation;

20 "(C) verification of the life cycle cost esti21 mate against independent cost estimates, and
22 reconciliation of any differences;

23 "(D) a cost-benefit analysis with sup-24 porting documentation; and

25 "(E) a schedule, including, as appropriate,
26 an integrated master schedule;

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1	((2)) prepare cost estimates and schedules for
2	major acquisition programs, as required under sub-
3	paragraphs (B) and (E), in a manner consistent
4	with best practices as identified by the Comptroller
5	General of the United States; and
6	((3) submit certain acquisition documentation
7	to the Secretary to produce an annual comprehen-
8	sive report on the status of departmental acquisi-
9	tions for submission to Congress.
10	"(b) WAIVER.—On a case-by-case basis, the Sec-
11	retary may waive the requirement under paragraph (3) of
12	subsection (a) for a fiscal year if either—
13	"(1) the program has not—
14	"(A) entered the full rate production phase
15	in the acquisition life cycle;
16	"(B) had a reasonable cost estimate estab-
17	lished; and
18	"(C) had a system configuration defined
19	fully; or
20	((2) the program does not meet the definition
21	of capital asset, as such term is defined by the Di-
22	rector of the Office of Management and Budget.
23	"(c) Congressional Oversight.—At the same
24	time the President's budget is submitted for a fiscal year
25	under section 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code, the

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Secretary shall make information available, as applicable, 1 2 to the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and Committee on Homeland Security 3 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate information on 4 the requirement under subsection (a) in the prior fiscal 5 year that includes the following specific information re-6 7 garding each program for which the Secretary has issued 8 a waiver under subsection (b):

9 "(1) The grounds for granting a waiver for that10 program.

11 "(2) The projected cost of that program.

12 "(3) The proportion of a component's or office's
13 annual acquisition budget attributed to that pro14 gram, as available.

15 "(4) Information on the significance of the pro16 gram with respect to the component's operations and
17 execution of its mission.

18 "(d) MAJOR ACQUISITION PROGRAM DEFINED.—In 19 this section, the term 'major acquisition program' means 20 a Department acquisition program that is estimated by 21 the Secretary to require an eventual total expenditure of 22 at least \$300,000,000 (based on fiscal year 2016 constant 23 dollars) over its life cycle cost."
