

**AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE  
NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 2825  
OFFERED BY MR. THOMPSON OF MISSISSIPPI**

At the end of subtitle A of title VI, add the following:

**1 SEC. 623. NON-PROFIT SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle A of title XX of the  
3 Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 601 et seq.),  
4 as amended by section 621 of this Act, is further amended  
5 by adding at the end the following new section:

**6 “SEC. 2010. NON-PROFIT SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM.**

7 “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the  
8 Department a program to be known as the ‘Non-Profit  
9 Security Grant Program’ (in this section referred to as  
10 the ‘Program’). Under the Program, the Secretary, acting  
11 through the Administrator, shall make grants to eligible  
12 nonprofit organizations described in subsection (b),  
13 through the State in which such organizations are located,  
14 for target hardening and other security enhancements to  
15 protect against terrorist attacks.

16 “(b) ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS.—Eligible nonprofit or-  
17 ganizations described in this subsection (a) are organiza-  
18 tions that are—

1           “(1) described in section 501(c)(3) of the Inter-  
2           nal Revenue Code of 1986 and exempt from tax  
3           under section 501(a) of such Code; and

4           “(2) determined to be at risk of a terrorist at-  
5           tack by the Administrator.

6           “(c) PERMITTED USES.—The recipient of a grant  
7           under this section may use such grant for any of the fol-  
8           lowing uses:

9           “(1) Target hardening activities, including  
10          physical security enhancement equipment and in-  
11          spection and screening systems.

12          “(2) Fees for security training relating to phys-  
13          ical security and cybersecurity, target hardening,  
14          terrorism awareness, and employee awareness.

15          “(3) Any other appropriate activity, as deter-  
16          mined by the Administrator.

17          “(d) PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE.—The Adminis-  
18          trator shall make funds provided under this section avail-  
19          able for use by a recipient of a grant for a period of not  
20          less than 36 months.

21          “(e) REPORT.—The Administrator shall annually for  
22          each of fiscal years 2018 through 2022 submit to the  
23          Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Rep-  
24          resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Security  
25          and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report con-

1 taining information on the expenditure by each grant re-  
2 cipient of grant funds made under this section.

3 “(f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—

4 “(1) IN GENERAL.—There is authorized to be  
5 appropriated \$50,000,000 for each of fiscal years  
6 2018 through 2022 to carry out this section.

7 “(2) SPECIFICATION.—Of the amounts author-  
8 ized to be appropriated pursuant to paragraph (1)—

9 “(A) \$35,000,000 is authorized for eligible  
10 recipients located in jurisdictions that receive  
11 funding under section 2003; and

12 “(B) \$15,000,000 is authorized for eligible  
13 recipients in jurisdictions not receiving funding  
14 under section 2003.”.

15 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Subsection (a) of  
16 section 2002 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6  
17 U.S.C. 603) is amended by striking “sections 2003 and  
18 2004” and inserting “sections 2003, 2004, and 2010”.

19 (c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents  
20 in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is  
21 amended by inserting after the item relating to section  
22 2008 the following new item:

“Sec. 2009. Non-Profit Security Grant Program.”.
