## A BILL

To authorize certain counter terrorist networks activities of U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Counter Terrorist Net-
- 5 work Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DUTY TO COUNTER TERRORIST NETWORKS; DE-
- 7 TAILS AND ASSIGNMENT.
- 8 Section 411 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
- 9 (6 U.S.C. 211) is amended—

1	(1) in subsection $(g)(4)$ —
2	(A) in subparagraph (C)—
3	(i) in clause (vi), by striking "and" at
4	the end;
5	(ii) by redesignating clause (vii) as
6	clause (viii); and
7	(iii) by inserting after clause (vi) the
8	following new clause:
9	"(vii) collaborate with appropriate
10	agencies, including Federal, State, local,
11	tribal, and international entities, to en-
12	hance border security through operations
13	such as operations that seek to disrupt and
14	dismantle networks, including foreign ter-
15	rorist organizations (as such term is de-
16	scribed in section 219 of the Immigration
17	and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189)), that
18	pose terrorist or other threats; and";
19	(2) by redesignating subsections (p) through (r)
20	as subsections (q) through (s), respectively; and
21	(3) by inserting after subsection (o) the fol-
22	lowing new subsection:
23	"(p) Assignment of Personnel.—The Commis-
24	sioner may detail or otherwise assign personnel of U.S.
25	Customs and Border Protection to other appropriate agen-

- 2 mation sharing partnership operations in furtherance of
- 3 enhancing border security, including by preventing entry
- 4 into the United States by individuals known or suspected
- 5 of being associated with a network, including a foreign ter-
- 6 rorist organization (as such term is described in section
- 7 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 8 1189)), that poses terrorist or other threats.".

## 9 SEC. 3. BRIEFINGS.

- The Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Pro-
- 11 tection shall biannually brief the Committee on Homeland
- 12 Security of the House of Representatives and Committee
- 13 on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the
- 14 Senate regarding activities, during the prior six months,
- 15 in furtherance of clause (vii) of section 411(g)(4) of the
- 16 Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 211(g)(4)), as
- 17 added by section 2 of this Act. Such briefings may be pro-
- 18 vided in a classified setting if Commissioner determines
- 19 such is appropriate.
