A BILL

To direct the Under Secretary for Intelligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and disseminate a threat assessment regarding terrorist use of ghost guns, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Homeland Security
- 5 Assessment of Terrorists Use of Ghost Guns Act".

1	SEC. 2. THREAT ASSESSMENT ON TERRORIST USE OF
2	GHOST GUNS.
3	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Under Secretary for Intel-
4	ligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Se-
5	curity shall, in coordination with appropriate Federal
6	partners, annually develop and disseminate a terrorism
7	threat assessment regarding the availability of ghost guns
8	in furtherance of an act of terrorism, including the provi-
9	sion of material support or resources to a foreign terrorist
10	organization. Consistent with the protection of classified
11	and confidential unclassified information, the Under Sec-
12	retary shall share the threat assessment developed under
13	this section with State, local, and Tribal law enforcement
14	officials, including officials who operate within State, local,
15	and regional fusion centers through the Department of
16	Homeland Security State, Local, and Regional Fusion
17	Center Initiative established in accordance with section
18	210A of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.
19	124h).
20	(b) Definitions.—In this section:
21	(1) Foreign terrorist organization.—The
22	term "foreign terrorist organization" means an or-
23	ganization designated as a foreign terrorist organiza-
24	tion under section 219 of the Immigration and Na-
25	tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189)

1	(2) GHOST GUN.—The term "ghost gun" means
2	a firearm, including a frame or receiver, that lacks
3	a unique serial number engraved or cast in metal,
4	metal alloy, or plastic on the frame or receiver by a
5	licensed manufacturer or importer, or is otherwise
6	assembled, molded, machined, or 3D printed without
7	being associated with a unique serial number.

(3) Frame or receiver' means the part of a firearm that can provide the action or housing for the hammer, bolt, or breechblock and firing mechanism, and includes a frame or lower receiver blank, casting, or machined body that requires further machining or molding to be used as part of a firearm, and which is designed or intended to be used in the assembly of a functional firearm.
