1	SEC. 2. NURSING FACILITIES FOR TRANSPORTATION SECU-
2	RITY ADMINISTRATION PERSONNEL.
3	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
4	date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of
5	the Transportation Security Administration shall ensure
6	that all Administration personnel have adequate access to
7	facilities designated for use by nursing mothers in the
8	workplace. Such facilities shall be—
9	(1) assessed for cleanliness, safety, and accessi-
10	bility to personnel duty stations;
11	(2) free of charge;
12	(3) located in a place, other than a bathroom,
13	that is shielded from view and free from intrusion
14	from coworkers and the public; and
15	(4) available for personnel to use with a reason-
16	able break time to express breast milk for a child of
17	such personnel each time such personnel has a need
18	to express milk.
19	(b) Duration.—The Administrator of the Transpor-
20	tation Security Administration shall ensure that the avail-
21	ability to Administration personnel described in subsection
22	(a)(4) is for a period of time equal to at least one year
23	from the birth of a child of an Administration employee.
24	(c) Coordination With Stakeholders.—In car-

coordinate with the National Institutes for Health and the labor organization representing Administration screening personnel. 3 SEC. 3.
