1           **TITLE V—COMMITTEE ON**

3   **SEC. 50001. CYBERSECURITY AND INFRASTRUCTURE SECU-**  
4           **RITY AGENCY.**

5           In addition to amounts otherwise made available,  
6 there is appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any  
7 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to re-  
8 main available until September 30, 2024—

9           (1) \$50,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
10          frastructure Agency for support of the Multi-State  
11          Information Sharing and Analysis Center;

12          (2) \$25,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
13          frastructure Security Agency for the execution of a  
14          national multi-factor authentication campaign;

15          (3) \$400,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
16          frastructure Security Agency for the implementation  
17          of Executive Order 14028 (86 Fed. Reg. 26633; re-  
18          lating to improving the cybersecurity of the United  
19          States), including the implementation of multi-factor

1 authentication, endpoint detection and response, im-  
2 proved logging, and securing cloud systems at Fed-  
3 eral agencies;

4 (4) \$50,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
5 frastructure Security Agency for expansion and op-  
6 eration of the Crossfeed program;

7 (5) \$10,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
8 frastructure Security Agency for performing activi-  
9 ties in support of the development of the continuity  
10 of the economy plan required under section 9603(a)  
11 of title XCVI of the William M. (Mac) Thornberry  
12 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year  
13 2021 (Public Law 116–283; 6 U.S.C. 322);

14 (6) \$20,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
15 frastructure Security Agency for expanding pro-  
16 grams working with international partners on the  
17 protection of critical infrastructure; and

18 (7) \$100,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
19 frastructure Security Agency for cybersecurity work-  
20 force development and education, including providing  
21 education, training, and capacity development to the  
22 Federal workforce and to the Cybersecurity Edu-  
23 cation and Training Program.
