COMMITTEE ACTION

May 18, 2023

The Committee on Homeland Security met, pursuant to notice, in open markup session, a quorum being present, on Wednesday, May 17, 2023 in 310 Cannon to consider the following measures:

H.R. 3286, (Mr. Green), to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish the duties of the Director of the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency regarding open source software security, and for other purposes; the "Securing Open Source Software Act of 2023."

H.R. 1501, (Mr. Guest), to prohibit the Secretary of Homeland Security from operating or procuring certain foreign-made unmanned aircraft systems, and for other purposes; the "Unmanned Aerial Security Act."

H.R. 3224, (Mr. D'Esposito), to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to extend the authorization of the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes; the "Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Extension Act of 2023."

H.R. 3208, (Ms. Jackson Lee), to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish a DHS Cybersecurity On-the-Job Training Program, and for other purposes; the "DHS Cybersecurity On-the-Job Training Program Act."

H.R. 3254, (Mr. Payne), to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish process to review applications for certain grants to purchase equipment or systems that do not meet or exceed any applicable national voluntary consensus standards, and for other purposes; the "First Responder Access to Innovative Technologies Act."

An amendment offered by Mr. Guest (01):

Strike "corporation" each place it appears and insert "business entity". Page 6, beginning line 18, insert the following:

- 1 (1) BUSINESS ENTITY.—The term "business
- 2 entity" has the meaning given such term in section
- 3 334 of the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (15 U.S.C.
- 4 6764).

was AGREED TO by voice vote.

A motion by Mr. Green to report H.R. 1501, as amended, to the House with a favorable recommendation; was AGREED TO by voice vote.

Without objection, the amendment to H.R. 1501 will be reported to the House in the form of one Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute; was NOT OBJECTED TO.

Without objection, staff is authorized to make technical and conforming changes to all measures to reflect the actions of the Committee; was NOT OBJECTED TO.
