A BILL

To direct the Comptroller General of the United States to conduct a review of the Homeland Security Information Network, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Streamlining Law En-
5 forcement Information Sharing Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. COMPTROLLER GENERAL REPORT ON THE HOME-**
2 **LAND SECURITY INFORMATION NETWORK.**

3 Not later than one year after the date of the enact-
4 ment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United
5 States shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Secu-
6 rity and the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence
7 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
8 Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs and the Se-
9 lect Committee on Intelligence of the Senate a report that
10 includes the following:

11 (1) An examination of how the Homeland Secu-
12 rity Information Network is used to share informa-
13 tion with Federal, State, local, Tribal, and territorial
14 law enforcement partners.

15 (2) A comparison of the use, by such law en-
16 forcement partners, on both desktops and mobile ap-
17 plications of the Homeland Security Information
18 Network to the use of other tools, including
19 JusticeConnect of the Federal Bureau of Investiga-
20 tions.

21 (3) An assessment of the cost, effectiveness,
22 and efficacy of the Homeland Security Information
23 Network.

24 (4) An assessment of the current policies of the
25 Homeland Security Information Network and the ef-

1 efficacy of such policies in protecting the civil rights,
2 civil liberties, and privacy of individuals.

3 (5) An analysis of any other information the
4 Comptroller General determines appropriate.
