

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
TO H.R. 9731
OFFERED BY MS. GREENE OF GEORGIA

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Special Interest Alien
3 Reporting Act of 2024”.

4 **SEC. 2. PUBLICATION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND**
5 **SECURITY OF THE NUMBER OF SPECIAL IN-**
6 **TEREST ALIENS ENCOUNTERED ATTEMPTING**
7 **TO UNLAWFULLY ENTER THE UNITED**
8 **STATES.**

9 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Not later than the seventh day of
10 each month, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall
11 publish on a publicly available webpage of the Department
12 of Homeland Security and submit to the Committee on
13 Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and
14 the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
15 Affairs of the Senate a report on the total number, and
16 an identification of the nationalities or countries of last
17 habitual residence, of special interest aliens encountered
18 by the Department attempting to unlawfully enter the

1 United States during the immediately preceding month.

2 Each such report shall also include the following:

3 (1) Such number disaggregated by geographic
4 regions of such encounters.

5 (2) Specifications relating to whether such en-
6 counters were made—

7 (A) at land, air, or sea ports of entry;

8 (B) between ports of entry; or

9 (C) in the interior of the United States.

10 (3) Identification of any such nationalities or
11 countries of last habitual residence that are covered
12 nations.

13 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

14 (1) ALIEN.—The term “alien” has the meaning
15 given such term in section 101 of the Immigration
16 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101).

17 (2) COVERED NATION.—The term “covered na-
18 tion” has the meaning given such term in section
19 4872(d)(2) of title 10, United States Code.

20 (3) SPECIAL INTEREST ALIEN.—The term “spe-
21 cial interest alien” means an alien who, based on an
22 analysis of travel patterns, potentially poses a na-
23 tional security risk to the United States or its inter-
24 ests.
