Jason Kane is a federal law enforcement special agent with over 24 years of federal and state government experience. He currently serves as the Special Agent in Charge of the Nashville District. Much of his career has been with the U.S. Secret Service focusing on the integrated mission of protection and investigations.

Mr. Kane also previously served as the Deputy Assistant Director for the Office of Investigations. In this role he managed a budget of \$85M dollars and helped plan, resource, and direct the agencies cyber crime mission across the globe. Mr. Kane also served as the Special Agent in Charge of the Criminal Investigative Division, where he was charged with supporting 162 offices with investigative and analytical support in the pursuit of cyber criminals. Mr. Kane also served as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the New York Field Office which is responsible for both investigative and protective operations in the New York tri state area. Prior to this assignment, Mr. Kane was the Assistant to the Special Agent in Charge in the Office of Investigations focusing on cyber policy, operations, and criminal investigations. In this position, he drafted and molded a new Cyber Retention Initiative which offers pay and training incentives to the U.S. Secret Service workforce. The result of this initiative is to keep prized personnel from leaving the government sector and moving to the private sector based on salary incentives.

Prior to these assignments, he was detailed to the staff of the National Security Council at the White House as the Director for Critical Infrastructure focusing on the areas of financial infrastructure and telecommunications. While in this position, he successfully drafted and presented Executive Order 13873: *Securing the Information and Communications Technology and Services Supply Chain* for President Trumps signature on May 15, 2019. The goal of this order is to provide the foundation regulation to secure the United States telecommunications supply chain.

His other Secret Service assignments were in the Criminal Investigative Division as the supervisor of the Special Projects and Policy Section. While in this position, he coordinated, led, and directed the Special Projects Branch by providing administrative support and guidance to executive level members of the division. He exercised fiscal control of the \$24 million dollar budget for the entire division to include approval of all expenditures to support annual operations.

Throughout his career, he has initiated and managed high profile transnational cyber investigations encompassing network intrusions and the theft of data and information from corporate, financial and government institutions. He performed these investigative duties bifurcated with his protective responsibilities while assigned as a member of the Electronic Crimes Task Force in the Chicago Field Office.

Prior to his Secret Service career, he was a practicing Attorney in the Nashville, TN serving under Judge Steve R. Dozier. He graduated from Middle Tennessee State University with a bachelor's of science degree and also received a Juris Doctorate from the Nashville School of Law.
