A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish the Intelligence Rotational Assignment Program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “DHS Intelligence Ro-
5 tational Assignment Program and Law Enforcement Sup-
6 port Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY INTEL-**
2 **LIGENCE ROTATIONAL ASSIGNMENT PRO-**
3 **GRAM.**

4 Section 844 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
5 (6 U.S.C. 414) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6 lowing new subsection:

7 “(b) INTELLIGENCE ROTATIONAL ASSIGNMENT PRO-
8 GRAM.—

9 “(1) ESTABLISHMENT.—Not later than one
10 year after the date of the enactment of this sub-
11 section, the Secretary shall establish an Intelligence
12 Rotational Assignment Program as part of the Rota-
13 tion Program under subsection (a).

14 “(2) ELIGIBILITY.—The Intelligence Rotational
15 Assignment Program shall be open to analysts serv-
16 ing in analyst positions in an intelligence component
17 of the Department, in the Office of Strategic Intel-
18 ligence and Information of the United States Secret
19 Service, or in other positions in the Department, as
20 determined by the Secretary.

21 “(3) COORDINATION.—The responsibilities
22 specified in subsection (a)(3)(B) that apply to the
23 Rotation Program under such subsection shall, as
24 applicable, apply to the Intelligence Rotational As-
25 signment Program under this subsection.”.
