Marshall McClain is a police officer and current President of the Los Angeles Airport Peace Officers' Association (LAAPOA) a non-profit organization in Los Angeles, California. LAAPOA represents the rank and file police and fire fighters sworn to protect all of the city's owned airports including Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). Officer McClain joined the Los Angeles Airport Police in 2002 after previously working as a Park Patrol Officer for the Los Angeles City Park Rangers. He serves on the board of directors for the Peace Officers Research Association of California (PORAC), the largest statewide public safety association with over 64,000 members. He currently resides in Los Angeles County with his wife and their two daughters. He remains active in the community and enjoys coaching youth and high school football and volunteering at his children's school and church.
