AMENDMENT TO H.R. 2750 OFFERED BY MISS RICE OF NEW YORK

In section 2 of the bill, in the proposed section 1601 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002, amend subsection (c) to read as follows:

1 "(c) INFORMATION SHARING.—By not later than De-2 cember 31, 2015, the Administrator may conduct a pilot 3 program of the Rap Back Service, in coordination with 4 the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, to 5 determine the feasibility of full implementation of a service through which the Administrator would be notified of a 6 change in criminal or certain civil activity of an individual 7 holding a valid credential granting unescorted access to 8 9 sensitive areas of airports across eligible Administration-10 regulated populations.".

At the end of the bill, add the following:

11 SEC. 3. STATUS UPDATE ON RAP BACK SERVICE PILOT 12 PROGRAM.

Not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Transportation
Security Administration shall submit to the Committee on
Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and

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the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental 1 2 Affairs and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a report on the status of 3 plans to conduct a pilot program in coordination with the 4 Federal Bureau of Investigation of the Rap Back Service 5 in accordance with subsection (c) of section 1601 of the 6 Homeland Security Act of 2002. The report shall include 7 8 details on the business, technical, and resource requirements for the Transportation Security Administration and 9 pilot program participants, and provide a timeline and 10 11 goals for the pilot program.

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
