 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Keeping our Travelers
- 5 Safe and Secure Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds the following:

1 (1) The Administrator of the Transportation 2 Security Administration has stated that the mainte-3 nance of security-related technology such as x-rays, 4 explosive trace detection systems, explosive detection 5 systems, liquid scanners, and enhanced walk-through 6 metal detectors, is central to the execution of Trans-7 portation Security Administration's mission to pro-8 tect United States transportation systems. 9 (2) Preventive and corrective maintenance is es-10 sential to ensuring and extending the service lives of 11 security-related technology. 12 (3) In May 2015, the Inspector General of the 13 Department of Homeland Security, reporting on the 14 results of a performance audit conducted between 15 December 2013 and November 2014, concluded that 16 because the Transportation Security Administration 17 did not properly manage the maintenance of its se-18 curity-related technology deployed to airports, it can-19 not be assured that routine preventive maintenance 20 is performed or that equipment is repaired and 21 ready for operational use. 22 (4) Specifically, the Inspector General found

that the Transportation Security Administration did
not issue adequate policies and procedures to document, track, and maintain preventive maintenance

actions at the airport level and oversight of con tractor-performed maintenance needed to be
 strengthened.

4 (5) According to the Inspector General, if the
5 equipment is not fully operational, the Transpor6 tation Security Administration may have to use
7 other screening measures that may be less effective
8 at detecting dangerous items, thereby potentially
9 jeopardizing passenger safety and security.

10 SEC. 3. MAINTENANCE OF SECURITY-RELATED TECH-11NOLOGY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Title XVI of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 561 et seq.) is amended by
adding at the end the following:

15 **"Subtitle C—Maintenance of**

16 Security-Related Technology

17 "SEC. 1621. MAINTENANCE VALIDATION AND OVERSIGHT.

"(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after
the date of the enactment of this subtitle, the Administrator shall develop and implement a preventive maintenance validation process for security-related technology
deployed to airports.

23 "(b) MAINTENANCE BY ADMINISTRATION PER-24 SONNEL AT AIRPORTS.—For maintenance to be carried

1 out by Administration personnel at airports, the process 2 referred to in subsection (a) shall include the following: 3 "(1) Guidance to Administration personnel at 4 airports specifying how to conduct and document 5 preventive maintenance actions. 6 "(2) Mechanisms for the Administrator to 7 verify compliance with the guidance issued pursuant 8 to paragraph (1). 9 "(c) MAINTENANCE BY CONTRACTORS AT AIR-PORTS.—For maintenance to be carried by a contractor 10 11 at airports, the process referred to in subsection (a) shall require the following: 12 13 "(1) Provision of monthly preventative mainte-14 nance schedules to appropriate Administration per-15 sonnel at each airport that includes information on 16 each action to be completed by contractor. 17 "(2) Notification to appropriate Administration 18 personnel at each airport when maintenance action 19 is completed by a contractor. 20 "(3) A process for independent validation by a 21 third party of contractor maintenance. 22 "(d) PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE.—The Ad-23 ministrator shall require maintenance contracts for secu-24 rity-related technology deployed to airports to include penalties for noncompliance when it is determined that either 25

preventive or corrective maintenance has not been com pleted according to contractual requirements and manu facturers' specifications.".
