

Jay Stanley is Senior Policy Analyst with the American Civil Liberties Union's Speech, Privacy and Technology Project, where he follows new technologies and helps the organization anticipate, explain, and reduce their potential impact on our privacy, free speech and other civil liberties.

Stanley has authored and co-authored hundreds of blog posts as well as a variety of influential ACLU reports and policy papers on new and emerging technologies.
