



Jack Cable is an ethical hacker turned founder, currently the CEO and co-founder of Corridor, a security company for the era of AI-written code. Prior to that, Jack served as a Senior Technical Advisor at the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), where he helped lead the agency's Secure by Design initiative.
