Adam Hunter is the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Immigration Policy at the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and was appointed on January 20, 2021. Mr. Hunter has nearly twenty years' experience on migration, national security, and international affairs issues. Before assuming his role at DHS, he was the Executive Director of Refugee Council USA (RCUSA), a coalition supporting and protecting the rights of forcibly displaced people. Prior roles included Director of the Immigration and the States Project at the Pew Charitable Trusts, and Consultant to several foundations and non-profit organizations. During a previous tenure in government, Mr. Hunter served as Acting Chief of Staff at U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), a component of DHS, and held other agency leadership and program management roles. Earlier in his career, he worked with policymakers in Europe and at Washington think tanks, including the German Marshall Fund of the United States.

Mr. Hunter holds a Bachelor of Arts from Vanderbilt University, a Master in Public Policy from the Harvard Kennedy School, and a Certificate in Diversity & Inclusion from Cornell University.
