Deputy Chief Martin Conway joined the Amtrak Police Department in September 2010. First assigned as Inspector of Patrol in the New York Division, he was promoted to Deputy Chief in August of 2014 and is responsible for policing the Metropolitan New York region, including Penn Station, the busiest transportation facility in North America.

Prior to joining the Amtrak Police Department he served as a member of the New York City Police Department for 26 years. While with the NYPD, he served as Commanding Officer of several commands within the Housing, Transit and Patrol Services Bureaus. In his most recent assignment with the NYPD, he was an Inspector in the Counterterrorism Division where he was responsible for coordinating all counterterrorism measures within the NYC subway system.

Deputy Chief Conway earned a Bachelor's Degree in Police Science and a Master's Degree in Protection Management at John Jay College of Criminal Justice, CUNY. He is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, PERF's Senior Management in Policing (SMIP) and the NYPD /Columbia University School of Business - Police Management Institute.
