During her tenure at GAO, Tina Won Sherman has led numerous reviews at the Departments of Defense, Homeland Security, and Transportation. Ms. Sherman is currently leading a portfolio of work that includes critical infrastructure protection, transportation security, and science and technology issues in GAO's Homeland Security and Justice Team. She has testified at congressional hearings and participated in media interviews on these issues.

Ms. Sherman previously contributed to agency-wide efforts assessing the federal government's role responding to Hurricane Katrina and implementing the Recovery Act and CARES Act; identifying areas of duplication and cost savings; and evaluating the progress of agencies as part of GAO's biennial High-Risk Update. She also served on a detail in GAO's Office of Congressional Relations, where she supported the Armed Services, Foreign Affairs and Foreign Relations, Intelligence, and Veterans' Affairs committees.

Prior to GAO, she worked at the New America Foundation, a non-partisan think tank. Ms. Sherman studied at the University of California, San Diego; Virginia Tech; and the University of Maryland, College Park. She holds a bachelor of arts, master of arts, and doctor of philosophy in government and politics.
