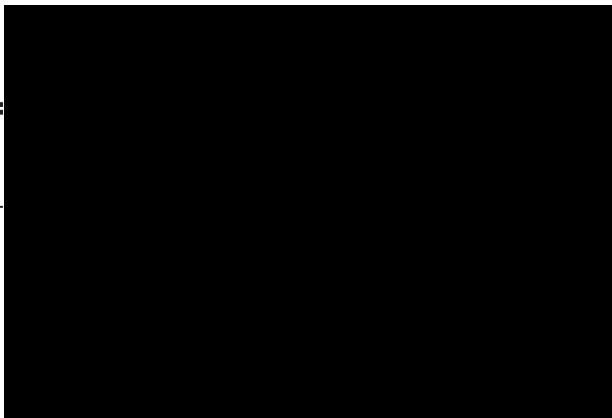

Robert Mayer

Robert Mayer is Vice-President of Industry and State Affairs with the United States Telecom Association (USTelecom) where he leads a variety of efforts involving industry analysis, homeland security and public safety, and state regulatory affairs. He serves as the Chairman of the Communications Sector Coordinating Council (CSCC), a 38-member organization representing wireline, wireless, cable, satellite, and broadcast interests in the national security and emergency preparedness community. He is also a member of the Department of Homeland Security's Telecommunications Service Priority (TSP) oversight committee.

Prior to joining USTelecom, Mr. Mayer served as the top New York State official on telecommunications as Director for the New York State Public Service Commission. In that capacity, he led several major initiatives including regulatory reform efforts based on Inter-modal competitive analyses, expanded entry into video markets, and network reliability and public safety matters. Prior to this appointment, he was the lead regulatory practitioner in the telecommunications and cable segments at BearingPoint, Inc., a top business consulting, systems integration and managed-services firm. Over the course of his consulting career, he worked with clients and state regulatory agencies on a wide range of issues related to industry finance, operations, and strategy.

Mr. Mayer held positions in telecommunications law and policy and technology management for the New York City Office of the Mayor, JP Morgan and Company, Chase Manhattan Bank and WestPoint Pepperell, Inc. He has also served as an adjunct professor at the State University at Albany, where he developed curriculum and taught undergraduate and graduate courses in Telecommunications management and policy.

Mr. Mayer received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the State University at Albany, a MA in Business Management from Central Michigan University, an MBA from Boston University, and a JD from New York Law School. He also served as a Communications and Intelligence Specialist in the United States Air Force, including a tour at NATO headquarters in Southern Europe, where he supervised telecommunications for regional command operations. Robert is admitted to the New York State and Washington D.C Bar.
