To require the Consumer Product Safety Commission to promulgate a consumer product safety rule for freestanding clothing storage units to protect children from tip-over related death or injury, and for other purposes.

CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY STANDARD TO PRO-6 TECT AGAINST TIP-OVER OF **CLOTHING** 7 STORAGE UNITS. 8 (a) CLOTHING STORAGE UNIT DEFINED.—In this section, the term "clothing storage unit" means any furniture item manufactured in the United States or im-10 11 ported for use in the United States that is intended for the storage of clothing, typical of bedroom furniture, in-13 cluding furniture items that— 14 (1) are commonly referred to as a chest, door 15 chest, chest of drawers, dresser, or bureau; or 16 (2) may contain a chest, door chest, chest of 17 drawers, dresser, or bureau. 18 (b) Consumer Product Safety Standard Re-19 QUIRED.— 20 (1) In general.—Except as provided in sub-21 section (c)(1), not later than 1 year after the date 22 of the enactment of this Act, the Consumer Product 23 Safety Commission shall—
