

1 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

2 Section 703 of the Office of National Drug Control
3 Policy Reauthorization Act of 2006 (21 U.S.C. 2003) is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 **“SEC. 703. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

6 “There are authorized to be appropriated to the
7 United States Anti-Doping Agency—

8 “(1) for fiscal year 2021, \$15,500,000;

9 “(2) for fiscal year 2022, \$16,200,000;

10 “(3) for fiscal year 2023, \$16,900,000;

11 “(4) for fiscal year 2024, \$17,700,000;

12 “(5) for fiscal year 2025, \$18,500,000;

13 “(6) for fiscal year 2026, \$21,900,000;

14 “(7) for fiscal year 2027, \$22,800,000;

15 “(8) for fiscal year 2028, \$24,900,000; and

16 “(9) for fiscal year 2029, \$23,700,000.”.

17 **SEC. 4. COORDINATION AND SHARING OF INFORMATION**
18 **WITH USADA.**

19 (a) INFORMATION SHARING.—Except as otherwise
20 prohibited by law and except in cases in which the integ-
21 rity of a criminal investigation would be affected, in fur-
22 therance of the obligation of the United States under Arti-
23 cle 7 of the Convention, the Attorney General, the Sec-
24 retary of Homeland Security, and the Commissioner of
25 Food and Drugs shall coordinate with the United States
26 Anti-Doping Agency with regard to any effort to prevent

1 the use of performance-enhancing drugs or prohibit per-
2 formance-enhancing methods by sharing with the United
3 States Anti-Doping Agency all information which may be
4 relevant to preventing the use of such performance-en-
5 hancing drugs or prohibiting such performance-enhancing
6 methods.

7 (b) CONVENTION DEFINED.—In this section, the
8 term “Convention” means the United Nations Edu-
9 cational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization Inter-
10 national Convention Against Doping in Sport done at
11 Paris October 19, 2005, and ratified by the United States
12 in 2008.
