3 (a) REGULATION OF BROADBAND RATES PROHIB-4 ITED.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 5 Federal Communications Commission may not regulate the rates charged for broadband internet access service. 6 7 (b) EXCEPTIONS.—Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the authority of the Commission to— 8 9 (1) condition receipt of universal service sup-10 port under section 254 of the Communications Act 11 of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 254) by a provider of broadband 12 internet access service on the regulation of the rates 13 charged by such provider for the supported service; 14 (2) enforce subpart Y of part 64 of title 47, 15 Code of Federal Regulations (relating to truth-in-16 billing requirements); or 17 (3) prohibit or restrict paid prioritization.

 shall not be construed to include data roaming or inter connection.

6 (1) BROADBAND INTERNET ACCESS SERVICE.—
7 The term "broadband internet access service" has
8 the meaning given such term in section 8.1 of title
9 47, Code of Federal Regulations.

10 (2) COMMISSION.—The term "Commission"
11 means the Federal Communications Commission.

12 (3) PAID PRIORITIZATION.—The term "paid 13 prioritization" means the management of the net-14 work of a provider of broadband internet access 15 service to directly or indirectly favor some traffic 16 over other traffic, including through use of tech-17 niques such as traffic shaping, prioritization, re-18 source reservation, or other forms of preferential 19 traffic management, either—

20 (A) in exchange for consideration (mone21 tary or otherwise) from a third party; or
22 (B) to benefit an affiliated entity.

(4) RATE.—The term "rate" means the amount
charged by a provider of broadband internet access
service for the delivery of broadband internet traffic.

(5) REGULATION.—The term "regulation" or
 "regulate" means, with respect to a rate, the use by
 the Commission of rulemaking or enforcement au thority to establish, declare, or review the reason ableness of such rate.
