The Committee on Energy and Commerce met, pursuant to notice, at 11:06 a.m., a quorum being present, for a hybrid markup in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, and remotely via the Committee's WebEx platform, Hon. Frank Pallone, Jr. (Chairman of the committee) presiding.
