This markup will take place in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, as well as remotely using Cisco WebEx online video conferencing. For members planning to attend in-person, the Committee notes that this markup is being held during the COVID-19 pandemic, therefore the Committee will adhere to the greatest extent possible to the safety guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Attending Physician of the Capitol. The bipartisan staff briefing for this markup will be held using Microsoft Teams on Tuesday, November 16, 2021, at 2:30 p.m. (EST). The Democratic staff briefing will be held immediately following the bipartisan briefing. The Republican staff briefing will be announced separately.
