SUBJECT: Committee on Energy and Commerce Markup, Wednesday, July 20, 2022

The Committee on Energy and Commerce will meet in a **hybrid open markup session** on **Wednesday, July 20, 2022, at 9:45 a.m. (EDT)**, and subsequent days as necessary, to consider the following legislation:

- **H.R. 3962**, the “Securing and Enabling Commerce Using Remote and Electronic Notarization Act of 2021” (*Rep. Dean (D-PA) and 32 original bipartisan cosponsors on 06/17/2021*)
- **H.R. 4081**, the “Informing Consumers About Smart Devices Act” (*Reps. Curtis (R-UT) and Moulton (D-MA) on 06/23/2021*)
- **H.R. 4551**, the “Reporting Attacks from Nations Selected for Oversight and Monitoring Web Attacks and Ransomware from Enemies Act” or the “RANSOMWARE Act” (*Rep. Bilirakis (R-FL) on 07/20/2021*)
- **H.R. 5313**, “Reese’s Law” (*Reps. Robin Kelly (D-IL), Arrington (R-TX), and Lieu (D-CA) on 09/21/2021*)
- **H.R. 6290**, the “Manufacturing.gov Act” (*Reps. Tonko (D-NY), Axne (D-IA), and Upton (R-MI) on 12/14/2021*)
- **H.R. 8152**, the “American Data Privacy and Protection Act” (*Reps. Pallone (D-NJ), Rodgers (R-WA), Schakowsky (D-IL), and Bilirakis on 06/21/2022*)

This markup will take place in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, as well as remotely using Cisco Webex online video conferencing. Members will receive Webex participant access information by email before the markup. No staff from member’s offices will be allowed in the Committee room. **However, one staffer from each members’ office may join the markup remotely as an attendee on Webex.** Each designated staff attendee should **register** at the provided link **by no later than Tuesday, July 19, 2022, at 5 p.m. (EDT)**. The public may view this markup via live webcast on the Committee’s website: <http://energycommerce.house.gov>.

For members planning to attend in-person, the Committee notes that this markup is being held during the COVID-19 pandemic, therefore the Committee will adhere to the greatest extent possible to the safety guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Attending Physician of the Capitol. Guidelines regarding the conduct of this markup were previously distributed.

The bipartisan staff briefing for this markup will be held using Microsoft Teams on Tuesday, July 19, 2022, at 3:30 p.m. (EDT). The Democratic staff briefing will be held immediately following the bipartisan briefing. The Republican staff briefing will be announced separately. Information for these briefings will be sent out later today.

As previously announced, amendments submitted at least four hours in advance will be granted priority consideration in markup. Amendments should be submitted in PDF format by email to the following Committee staff members: **Chloe Rodriguez** (chloe.rodriguez@mail.house.gov) and **Perry Hamilton** (perry.hamilton@mail.house.gov).

Any information with respect to an amendment's parliamentary standing (e.g., its germaneness) should be submitted at the same time. The briefing memorandum and copies of the bills or committee prints are attached.
