FULL COMMITTEE HYBRID MARKUP

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 14, 2022

The Committee on Energy and Commerce met, pursuant to notice, at 10:46 a.m., a quorum being present, for a hybrid markup in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, and remotely via the Committee's Webex platform, Hon. Frank Pallone, Jr. (Chairman of the committee) presiding. The business before the Committee was consideration and markup of H. Res. 1476. The following actions were taken:

1. **H. Res. 1476**, a resolution of inquiry requesting the President to provide to the House of Representatives certain documents or records relating to coordination between social media companies and the Biden administration on information, censorship, and censorship meetings in order to suppress or deplatform persons or information the administration views as misinformation, disinformation, and malinformation on COVID–19, Hunter Biden, and elections, and certain documents or records relating to plans to provide grant funding to consortiums, including the Democratic National Committee, in the United States, was ordered reported *adversely* to the House, **without amendment**, by a roll call vote of 28 yeas to 23 nays (*Roll call no. 162*) (**Final Passage**).

No amendments were offered during consideration of H. Res. 1476.

Whereupon, there being no further business, the Committee adjourned at 11:18 a.m., subject to the call of the Chairman.
