A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Energy from enforcing energy efficiency standards applicable to manufactured housing, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Affordable Housing
5 Over Mandating Efficiency Standards Act” or the “Af-
6 fordable HOMES Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS**
2 **FOR MANUFACTURED HOUSING.**

3 (a) REPEAL.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Energy Independence
5 and Security Act of 2007 (42 U.S.C. 17071) is
6 amended by striking section 413.

7 (2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of con-
8 tents in section 1(b) of the Energy Independence
9 and Security Act of 2007 is amended by striking the
10 item relating to section 413.

11 (b) NO FORCE OR EFFECT.—The final rule titled
12 “Energy Conservation Program: Energy Conservation
13 Standards for Manufactured Housing” published by the
14 Department of Energy in the Federal Register on May
15 31, 2022 (87 Fed. Reg. 32728), shall have no force or
16 effect.
