A BILL

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 3 4 This Act may be cited as the "Secure Space Act of 2025". 5 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON GRANT OF CERTAIN SATELLITE 6 7 LICENSES, UNITED STATES MARKET ACCESS, 8 OR EARTH STATION AUTHORIZATIONS. 9 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secure and Trusted Communications Networks Act of 2019 (47 U.S.C. 1601 et seq.) 10 11 is amended— 12 (1) by redesignating sections 10 and 11 as sec-13 tions 11 and 12, respectively; and 14 (2) by inserting after section 9 the following: "SEC. 10. PROHIBITION ON GRANT OF CERTAIN SATELLITE 15 16 LICENSES, UNITED STATES MARKET ACCESS, 17 **OR EARTH STATION AUTHORIZATIONS.** 18 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Commission may not grant 19 a license for, or a petition for a declaratory ruling to ac-20 cess the United States market using, a geostationary orbit 21 satellite system or a nongeostationary orbit satellite system, or an authorization to use an individually licensed 22 earth station or a blanket-licensed earth station, if such 23

license, grant of market access, or authorization would be
 held or controlled by—

3 "(1) an entity that produces or provides any
4 covered communications equipment or service; or

5 "(2) an affiliate (as defined in section 3 of the
6 Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 153)) of an
7 entity described in paragraph (1).

8 "(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

9 "(1) BLANKET-LICENSED EARTH STATION.— 10 The term 'blanket-licensed earth station' means an 11 earth station that is licensed with a geostationary 12 orbit satellite system or a nongeostationary orbit 13 satellite system.

14 "(2) GATEWAY STATION.—The term 'gateway
15 station' means an earth station or a group of earth
16 stations that—

17 "(A) supports the routing and switching
18 functions of a geostationary orbit satellite sys19 tem or a nongeostationary orbit satellite sys20 tem;

21 "(B) may also be used for telemetry, track22 ing, and command transmissions;

23 "(C) does not originate or terminate com24 munication traffic; and

1 "(D) is not for the exclusive use of any 2 customer.

3 "(3) INDIVIDUALLY LICENSED EARTH STA4 TION.—The term 'individually licensed earth station'
5 means—

6 "(A) an earth station (other than a blan-7 ket-licensed earth station) that sends a signal 8 to, and receives a signal from, a geostationary 9 orbit satellite system or a nongeostationary 10 orbit satellite system; or

11 "(B) a gateway station.".

(b) APPLICABILITY.—Section 10 of the Secure and
Trusted Communications Networks Act of 2019, as added
by subsection (a), shall apply with respect to the grant
of a license, petition, or authorization on or after the date
of the enactment of this Act.

(c) RULES.—Not later than 1 year after the date of
the enactment of this Act, the Federal Communications
Commission shall issue rules to implement section 10 of
the Secure and Trusted Communications Networks Act of
2019, as added by subsection (a).
