

**AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE
NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 2483
OFFERED BY M ____ . _____**

At the end of the bill, add the following:

1 SEC. ____ . CONDITIONAL EFFECTIVENESS.

2 This Act (and the amendments made by this Act)
3 shall be made effective only if the Secretary of Health and
4 Human Services, acting on the Secretary’s own initiative
5 or at the initiative of the United States DOGE Service
6 (commonly referred to as the “Department of Government
7 Efficiency” or “DOGE”), or any DOGE agency team or
8 teams involved—

9 (1) halts all efforts to reorganize the Substance
10 Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration
11 until the date on which a Federal law is enacted
12 that specifically authorizes such a reorganization;
13 and

14 (2) halts all efforts to eliminate or substantially
15 impair, until the date on which a Federal law is en-
16 acted that specifically authorizes such elimination or
17 substantial impairment, the programs and activities
18 under—

1 (A) section 546 of the Public Health Serv-
2 ice Act (42 U.S.C. 290ee–1; relating to the first
3 responder training program);

4 (B) section 508 of such Act (42 U.S.C.
5 290bb–1; relating to residential treatment pro-
6 grams for pregnant and postpartum women);

7 (C) section 7132 of the SUPPORT for Pa-
8 tients and Communities Act (Public Law 115–
9 271; 132 Stat. 4046; relating to the task force
10 on best practices for trauma-informed identi-
11 fication, referral, and support);

12 (D) section 547 of the Public Health Serv-
13 ice Act (42 U.S.C. 290ee–2; relating to building
14 communities of recovery);

15 (E) section 547A of such Act (42 U.S.C.
16 290ee–2a; relating to the peer support technical
17 assistance center);

18 (F) section 552 of such Act (42 U.S.C.
19 290ee–7; relating to comprehensive opioid re-
20 covery centers);

21 (G) section 7102(c) of the SUPPORT for
22 Patients and Communities Act (42 U.S.C.
23 290bb–7a(c); relating to youth prevention and
24 recovery);

1 (H) section 7183 of such Act (42 U.S.C.
2 290ee–8; relating to the CAREER Act); and
3 (I) section 8071 of such Act (42 U.S.C.
4 5301 note; Public Law 115–271; relating to the
5 pilot program to help individuals in recovery
6 from a substance use disorder become stably
7 housed).
