CAPT Krista M. Pedley is the Director of the Office of Pharmacy Affairs (OPA) in the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Her office administers the 340B Drug Pricing Program through which hospitals and certain Federal grantees are eligible to purchase covered outpatient drugs at discounted prices.

CAPT Pedley began her career as a pharmacist with the United States Public Health Service in 2000. She was assigned to the Food and Drug Administration, Office of Generic Drugs, as a Project Manager for Bioequivalence and then as Medical Affairs Coordinator reviewing topical drug protocol design. After five years, CAPT Pedley transferred to the HRSA and then the Office of the Secretary of Health and Human Services where she served as Senior Public Health Analyst for the National Bioterrorism Hospital Preparedness Program (NBHPP). In 2007, CAPT Pedley began working with OPA where she led a national collaborative that focused on integrating clinical pharmacy services into primary care in order to improve the health of patients with multiple chronic conditions. She then became the Director of OPA in July of 2010.

CAPT Pedley received her Doctorate of Pharmacy degree at the University of Pittsburgh in 2000 and her Master of Science degree in Engineering Management and Systems Engineering, with a Concentration in Crisis, Emergency and Risk Management from George Washington University in 2008.
