

Dr. Macaya Douoguih, MD, MPH, Head, Janssen Clinical Development and Medical Affairs, Vaccines



Macaya Douoguih is the Head of Clinical Development and Medical Affairs in Janssen Vaccines, and a member of the Vaccines Senior Leadership Team. Macaya heads a team of 30 physicians and scientists that lead the clinical development of a portfolio of viral and bacterial vaccine programs.

During her time in J&J, she has served as a Clinical Franchise Leader for Emerging Diseases, and has been the Medical Leader for multiple viral vectored vaccine development programs focused on TB, Malaria, RSV, Zika and Ebola as well as therapeutic influenza monoclonal antibody programs.

Prior to J&J, Macaya led TB vaccine development at Aeras; she worked as a Medical Officer at the National Institutes of Health, involved in clinical and epidemiologic research focused on therapeutic interventions for infectious diseases such as HIV, Malaria, TB, as well as perinatal health in low-income settings. She also has also worked for the Pan American health Organization in the Expanded Programme on Immunization in South America.

Macaya is medical doctor with a degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Wisconsin and board certifications in Family Medicine and Preventive Medicine; she also obtained a M.P.H. from Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, Maryland.
