Hawaiian Electric has not received any Federal grants or contracts, or contracts or payments originating with a foreign government, on or after January 1, 2020 that are related to the subject matter of the hearing.

However, on August 29, 2023, Hawaiian Electric was notified that the U.S. Department of Energy (“DOE”) has recommended for award, subject to negotiation of the terms of financial assistance, Hawaiian Electric’s application for \$95 million in Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 funding for its Climate Adaptation Program (“Resilience Program”) submitted in response to Funding Opportunity Announcement Number DE-FOA-0002740. In its selection letter to Hawaiian Electric, the DOE indicated that it would soon begin the negotiation process and the necessary requirements to finalize the award based on this application.

On August 28, 2023, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (“FEMA”) announced the selection of the Ko‘olaupoko project for further review under its Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities Grant Program. This Ko‘olaupoko project application, submitted under FEMA BRIC (2022), subgrant ID number EMF-2022-BR-014-0004, requests \$8.33 million to develop three Critical Customer Hubs in the Ko‘olaupoko region of O‘ahu to keep the power on during severe weather and long outages. By selecting the project, FEMA has found that the project meets the basic eligibility requirements and can enter the next phase of the awards review process.
