Kaye Lynn Wootton serves as President for the National Association of Medicaid Fraud Control Units (NAMFCU). She is also the Director of Utah's Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, Office of the Utah Attorney General. Kaye Lynn began her career as a registered nurse over 40 years ago and has a master's degree in nursing. Kaye Lynn enjoyed a diverse nursing career where she had the opportunity to work in hospital, home health, education and pharmaceutical research settings. She co-owned and operated a successful home health agency for many years. Later in life, Kaye Lynn decided to shift gears and become an attorney. While many viewed this as a complete career change, Kaye Lynn viewed it as one more step in her journey to protect patients and advocate for quality health care.

As an Assistant Attorney General, Kaye Lynn's duties include prosecuting provider fraud and the abuse, neglect and exploitation of vulnerable individuals. Kaye Lynn is also cross-designated as a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney, a position that allows her to collaborate closely with federal partners to pursue fraud committed against Medicare, Medicaid, and other government payers.

Kaye Lynn has been actively involved with NAMFCU since 2011 and was elected as NAMFCU Vice President in 2025 and President in 2026. Throughout Kaye Lynn's tenure with NAMFCU, she has served on NAMFCU's Training Committee, Finance Committee, Executive Committee and as a facilitator for multiple NAMFCU training courses.

Kaye Lynn is frequently asked to present at health care fraud training programs. Over the past year, she has given presentations for NAMFCU, the National Association for Medicaid Program Integrity and the National Health Care Anti-Fraud Association. Throughout Utah, Kaye Lynn gives presentations to State agencies, provider organizations and consumers. These efforts are all aimed at combatting Medicaid fraud and protecting vulnerable individuals.
