

**John E. Shelk**  
**President and Chief Executive Officer**  
**Electric Power Supply Association**

**John E. Shelk** has been the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Electric Power Supply Association (EPSA) since June 2005. EPSA is the national trade association representing leading competitive electricity suppliers. EPSA members include independent power producers, generation affiliates of utility holding companies in competitive markets, and power marketers. Mr. Shelk is responsible for the overall management of the association and its strategic direction, including legislative affairs, regulatory policy and public affairs. He serves as an *ex officio* member of the association's Executive Committee, which is comprised of member company CEOs and other senior executives.

Mr. Shelk has had a long and distinguished career in public service and in the private sector with an emphasis on energy and environmental issues. Prior to joining EPSA, he was the Senior Vice President of Government Affairs for the National Mining Association. His government career was capped by service as a counsel to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce on matters before the Subcommittee on Energy and Power and the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations. These duties included major responsibilities associated with the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 and what became the Energy Policy Act of 1992.

Following government service, Mr. Shelk assumed a series of positions with increasing responsibility in a variety of business sectors: Federal Affairs Counsel, The Hartford Financial Services Group (1992-1995); Assistant General Counsel, ITT Corporation (1995-1997); Vice President, American Gaming Association (1997-2001); Director, Federal Affairs, Enron Corporation (2001) and Director of Federal Relations for Calpine Corporation (2002-2003). He also worked in the private practice of law as an associate at Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher (1987-1988).

Mr. Shelk earned his J.D. degree with honors from Georgetown University Law Center and an A.B degree with honors in American Government from Georgetown's College of Arts and Sciences, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa and selected as a George F. Baker Scholar. He is a frequent public speaker and has been quoted in national publications such as *The New York Times* and *The Wall Street Journal* as well as in the industry trade press. He has testified before Congress, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, and state regulatory bodies. He has participated as a member of the Keystone Center's Energy Board, Harvard University's Electricity Policy Group, and the Aspen Institute's Energy Policy Forum. He is a member of the Energy Bar Association, the District of Columbia Bar and the State Bar of California (inactive). He has written electricity policy articles for *Electricity Journal* and *ElectricityPolicy.Com*.
