Biography of Scott Faber

Scott Faber is the Senior Vice President of EWG, a research-based advocacy organization. He joined EWG in 2012, and has since led EWG's efforts to reform farm, food and renewable fuels policies. From 2007 to 2012, Faber was the Vice President for Government Affairs for the Grocery Manufacturers Association, where he led GMA's efforts to highlight the impacts of renewable fuel policies on food prices and led efforts to enact new food safety laws. From 2000 to 2007, Faber was a campaign manager for the Environmental Defense Fund, where he led efforts to reform farm policies and to restore the Mississippi and Missouri rivers. Prior to joining EDF, Faber was a Senior Director for American Rivers. Faber has repeatedly served as an expert on renewable fuel, farm, food and water policies and served on the USDA-DOE Biomass Research and Development Technical Advisory Committee. Faber holds a J.D. from Georgetown University Law Center.
