RANDAL (RANDY) S. LIVINGSTON

Randal (Randy) S. Livingston currently serves as vice president, Power Generation, for Pacific Gas and Electric Company, headquartered in San Francisco, CA. In this role, Livingston is responsible for the operation, maintenance, licensing and construction of the Utility's 3900 MW of hydro generation, 1400 MW of fossil generation, and construction/startup of the Utility's planned 600 MW of new gas fired generation and 250MW of solar photovoltaic generation. His organization is also responsible for managing approximately 1000MW of hydro generation in partnership contracts with water agencies and irrigation districts. PG&E's hydro system extends from the Cascades to the southern Sierra and is comprised of 110 units at 68 powerhouses and 26 separate FERC licenses.

Livingston's 30+ years of experience in the Generation business has given him a background in geothermal, conventional and combined cycled fossil generation, hydro generation, and other renewables. His career has spanned both staff and field leadership, working at one time at each of PG&E's major fossil facilities. Livingston was closely involved in reaching collaborative settlement on PG&E's award-winning Mokelumne and Rock Creek - Cresta relicensings, both long-running proceedings. These settlements have been used in other California relicensing settlements and set the groundwork for PG&E's 12 other relicensing efforts that have since followed.

Livingston is a 1980 magna cum laude graduate of the University of Washington with a degree in mechanical engineering. He was born and raised in Washington and serves on a variety of non-profit boards including the Stewardship Council.
