SUMMARY

Thirty years of senior management, project management, and contract management experience in electric delivery, power generation, fiber optic, and other construction environments. Currently manage a vertically integrated electric utility with a staff of professionals and union personnel responsible power generation, transmission & distribution, and a complete line of broadband services. Experienced in leadership role negotiating in union environment.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- As General Manager of the Braintree Electric Light Department for the last 11 years have successfully lead and managed a professional staff delivering high reliability and low cost service to the rate payers of Braintree. Accomplishments have included development and construction of a \$110M power plant, management of an \$85M annual budget and providing broadband services in a highly competitive environment.
- By implementing sound project management principles, gained control of an \$8M budget and turned around a major electric delivery construction project; improved the morale of over 60 personnel involved. In the next budget year, the asset management group increased the budget to \$13M. Increase was due to demonstrated improvement in productivity and restored credibility of the project team.
- Assigned by Boston Edison's senior management to implement a strategic venture with RCN to build a hybrid fiber/coaxial network in its service territory (40 cities and towns). As Manager, had full oversight responsibility for all aspects of construction. The company committed to spend \$50M a year for the five years of construction. Created an organization with 30 full-time Boston Edison and contract management personnel, supervising up to 150 field construction employees. Project was considered reimbursable and contributed \$12M to the business unit's bottom line.
- Managed outages / overhauls of Boston Edison's power plants having a major impact on the profitability of the company. During one such overhaul, coordinated the repair of the low-pressure turbine rotors whose delay could have cost millions of dollars in replacement power. Supervised shipment of two rotors from South Boston, MA to Chicago, IL to General Electric's repair facility. Coordinated a major schedule revision to minimize the cost and duration of the outage.
