Keith Rothfus was sworn in on January 3, 2015 and is serving his second term in the United States House of Representatives. He represents Pennsylvania's Twelfth Congressional District, which includes all of Beaver County and portions of Allegheny, Cambria, Lawrence, Somerset, and Westmoreland Counties in Western Pennsylvania.

Keith is working hard to advocate for policies that grow our economy, foster job creation, reduce our national debt and deficits, support our veterans, and save and secure Medicare and Social Security.

Keith serves on the Financial Services Committee and its subcommittees on Financial Institutions & Consumer Credit; Housing and Insurance; and Terrorism Financing Task Force.

Keith graduated from the State University of New York College at Buffalo with a Bachelor of Science degree and earned his law degree at the University of Notre Dame.

He spent most of his professional life in the private sector. As an attorney, he helped businesses of all sizes expand and create jobs in Western Pennsylvania.
