Sofie E. Miller is a Senior Policy Analyst at the George Washington University Regulatory Studies Center. Her research portfolio includes use of benefit-cost analysis by agencies, retrospective review of existing rules, economic analysis of energy efficiency standards, quantitative analysis of regulatory benefits, and the regressive effects of regulation. Sofie has drawn on this research to submit over twenty public comments to federal agencies on their proposed rules, which span the topics of energy and environment, consumer safety, transportation, reducing regulatory burdens, and enhancing competition through regulatory policy.

Sofie has presented her research at multiple academic conferences over the years, including recent presentations at the Society for Benefit-Cost Analysis conference and the Southern Economic Association conference. Sofie has published articles in academic journals of public policy and administrative law, including the *Administrative Law Review* Accord, and her work has been cited in the *Washington Post*, *Bloomberg BNA*, *Morning Consult*, *Reuters*, and *The Hill*. She is also the co-author of a chapter on energy efficiency in a forthcoming book in Palgrave MacMillan's *Advances in Behavioral Economics* series.

Since 2012, Sofie has served as Editor in Chief of the Regulatory Studies Center's weekly *Regulation Digest*, which reaches over 1,300 subscribers with weekly updates on regulatory developments in agencies, think tanks, the media, and academia. Sofie has a master's degree in public policy with a concentration in regulatory policy from the George Washington University.
