

Andy Black became President and CEO of the Association of Oil Pipe Lines (AOPL) in 2009. AOPL promotes responsible liquids pipeline policies on economic and commercial, capacity expansion, and pipeline safety issues, improved pipeline safety performance, and increased public support for liquid pipelines. AOPL's members transport more than 96 percent of the crude oil, refined products, and natural gas liquids moved by transmission pipelines in the U.S.

Andy previously served in a government relations position in Washington for the El Paso Corporation, a natural gas pipeline company. Prior to that, he was Director of the Office of External Affairs for the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). He earlier worked on Capitol Hill for the House Committee on Energy and Commerce and for Congressman Joe Barton.

Mr. Black has a B.S. in Economics from Texas Christian University and an M.B.A. from the University of Maryland.
