

- Lead statewide planning and program implementation for energy efficiency, fuel storage tanks, energy emergencies, policy planning and renewable energy programs.
- Direct a staff and expenditures of up to \$240 million.
- Develop and implement guaranteed energy saving performance contracting program to finance \$80 million in energy projects to save energy in state-owned facilities using third-party financing.
- Direct the Fuel Storage Tank program, providing training to ensure regulatory compliance and overseeing construction, repairs and remediation at all state-owned fuel tank locations.
- Build and maintain public and private sector relationships with key state, regional and national partners in energy supply, efficiency, renewables, policy and education. National organizations include U.S. DOE, EPA and National Association of State Energy Officials (board member and energy security committee chair).
- Assess, reorganize and add staff positions to optimize results from staff of 16 at the peak of activity.

- Implement cross-cutting initiatives with other divisions at GEFA focused on water infrastructure.
- Develop policy documents such as the State Energy Strategy Update and serve as the state spokesperson on energy programs.
- Lead an emergency management team during energy emergencies, carrying out Emergency Support Function 12 (Energy) at the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency.
