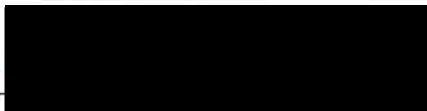

## Biography - Lisa G. McAlister

Lisa G. McAlister is Senior Vice President and General Counsel of Regulatory Affairs for American Municipal Power, Inc., a non-profit wholesale power supplier and service provider for 135 members across a nine state footprint that collectively serve more than 650,000 customers. As General Counsel for Regulatory Affairs, McAlister advises the organization regarding regulatory oversight and compliance matters and advocates on behalf of AMP before state, regional and federal regulatory agencies.

McAlister joined the AMP staff in 2012 as Deputy General Counsel FERC/RTO Affairs and was named to her current position in February 2017. She previously served as Of Counsel at Bricker & Eckler, LLC, where she represented the Ohio Manufacturers' Association and helped found the OMA Energy Group to address energy issues. Prior to that, she was a partner-elect at McNeese Wallace & Nurick, LLC, where she represented large commercial and industrial customers on energy issues, as well as natural gas utilities.

McAlister holds a bachelor's degree from Elon University in political science and philosophy and a law degree from the Ohio State University Michael E. Moritz College of Law.

McAlister currently serves as the chair of APPA's Legal Section, having previously served as vice chair. As an active participant on PJM committees, she served three years on the PJM Board Nominating Committee as the Electric Distributor Sector representative, and has represented the Electric Distributor Sector on various PJM Board Liaison Committees and Grid 20/20 panels. McAlister has also represented AMP and public power interests before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, including, most recently at the Technical Conference on State Policies and Wholesale Markets Operated by ISO New England Inc., New York Independent System Operator, Inc., and PJM Interconnection, L.L.C.
