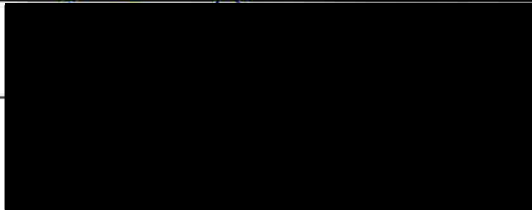

Biographical Information

Jack Reasor, President and CEO of Old Dominion Electric Cooperative was born in Danville, VA. He received his B.A. from Lincoln Memorial University in Harrogate, TN and then graduated from the T.C. Williams School of Law at the University of Richmond, VA. He became a member of the State Bar of Virginia in 1978.

He formerly served as a Vice President of First Virginia Bank in Bluefield and was a partner in the law firm of Galumbeck, Simmons, and Reasor in Tazewell, VA.

From 1992-98 he was a Virginia state senator from Southwest Virginia, representing the 38th Senate District. He served on several committees, including the VA Code Commission and was chairman of the Electric Utility Restructuring Sub-committee. He also was chairman of the Virginia Coal and Energy Commission.

Jack and his wife are the parents of a daughter, Megan and a son, Bryan and they have two grandchildren.

Jack currently serves as Chair of the VA Advanced Study Strategies, the NRECA Regulatory Committee and is a member of the Electricity Sub-sector Coordinating Council. He is a past Chairman of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce and Averett University.
