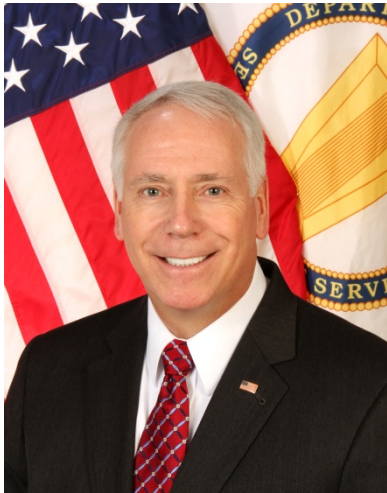

Mr. Ray Alexander was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in November 2014 and serves as the Chief, Interagency and International Services (IIS) for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). In this capacity, he provides executive leadership for developing and managing enterprise strategic relationships and business initiatives that leverage USACE capabilities in support of domestic interagency and intergovernmental partners, Combatant Commands, and the security assistance and cooperation activities of other U.S. Government agencies and international partners around the globe. Mr. Alexander has over 38 years of combined federal and private sector experience. Prior to assuming this position, Mr. Alexander served as Senior Director for Response Policy on the National Security Council Staff, in the Executive Office of the President, the White House, where he oversaw national and homeland security policy focused on the development and sustainment of national resilience. Mr. Alexander is currently dual-hatted as both Chief, IIS and as Director Contingency Operations/Homeland Security.

The USACE workforce of approximately 33,000 Civilians and Soldiers is dispersed across the country and in more than 130 countries delivering engineering expertise and solutions. USACE core capabilities include engineering, design, construction, water resources, infrastructure development, real estate, research and development, environmental management, disaster readiness, and contingency operations.
