## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the extreme weather emergency preparedness of
3	facilities for providing electric service.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 35, Utilities Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 35.0021 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 35.0021. WEATHER EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS. (a) In this
8	section, "extreme weather emergency" means a period when:
9	(1) the previous day's highest temperature did not
10	exceed 10 degrees Fahrenheit and the temperature is predicted to
11	remain at or below that level for the next 24 hours according to the
12	nearest National Weather Service reports; or
13	(2) the National Weather Service issues a heat
14	advisory for any county in the relevant service territory, or when
15	such an advisory has been issued on any one of the previous two
16	calendar days.
17	(b) The commission by rule shall require each provider of
18	generation in the ERCOT power region to:
19	(1) implement measures to prepare generation
20	facilities to provide adequate electric generation service during
21	an extreme weather emergency;
22	(2) make all reasonable efforts to prevent
23	interruptions of service during an extreme weather emergency;
24	(3) reestablish service within the shortest possible

- 1 time, should an <u>interruption occur due to an extreme weather</u>
- 2 emergency; and
- 3 (4) make reasonable efforts to manage emergencies
- 4 resulting from a failure of service caused by an extreme weather
- 5 emergency, including issuing instructions to its employees on
- 6 procedures to be followed in the event of an extreme weather
- 7 emergency.
- 8 (c) The rules adopted under Subsection (b) may not neglect
- 9 any local neighborhood or geographic area, including rural areas,
- 10 communities of less than 1000 people, and low-income areas.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 38, Utilities Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 38.074 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 38.074. WEATHER EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS. (a) In this
- 14 section, "extreme weather emergency" has the meaning assigned by
- 15 Subsection 35.0021(a), Utilities Code.
- 16 (b) The commission by rule shall require each electric
- 17 cooperative, municipally owned utility, and transmission and
- 18 <u>distribution</u> utility providing transmission or distribution
- 19 service in the ERCOT power region to:
- 20 (1) implement measures to prepare facilities to
- 21 maintain service quality and reliability during a weather emergency
- 22 (2) make all reasonable efforts to prevent
- 23 <u>interruptions of service during an extreme weather emergency;</u>
- 24 (3) reestablish service within the shortest possible
- 25 time, should an interruption occur due to an extreme weather
- 26 emergency; and
- 27 (4) make <u>reasonable efforts to manage emergencies</u>

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- 1 resulting from a failure of service caused by an extreme weather
- 2 emergency, including issuing instructions to its employees on
- 3 procedures to be followed in the event of an extreme weather
- 4 emergency.
- 5 (c) The rules adopted under Subsection (b) may not neglect
- 6 any local neighborhood or geographic area, including rural areas,
- 7 communities of less than 1000 people, and low-income areas.
- 8 SECTION 3. The public utility commission shall adopt rules
- 9 as required by Sections 35.0021 and 38.074, Utilities Code, as
- 10 added by this Act, not later than November 1, 2020.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
