Thomas P. Smith, P.E.

Mr. Thomas P. Smith currently serves as the Chief of Operations and Regulatory for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Corps Headquarters in Washington, D.C. providing national oversight of the development, resourcing, and delivery of Operations and Maintenance programs for the Civil Works infrastructure portfolio such as navigation, hydroelectric power, public recreation, environmental restoration, asset management, cybersecurity and sustainability. Mr. Smith also has executive oversight of the Army's regulatory role over navigable waters of the United States and the Clean Water Act. Additionally, he provides executive integration for activities and programs within the Corps' Great Lakes and Ohio River Division and North Atlantic Division. From July 2021 through January 2022 Mr. Smith performed a detail as the SES Director of Programs for the Southwestern Division, US Army Corps of Engineers, Dallas TX. In this role Mr. Smith had executive leadership responsibility for direction, staff management, and program management of the Division's Civil Works, Military Missions, and Interagency Support Programs. He was selected into the Senior Executive Service in July 2013 with an initial assignment to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

Prior to his assignment to the Army of Corps of Engineers, Mr. Smith served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Plans within DHS with additional responsibilities as the DHS Coordinator for the Campaign to Secure the Southern Border and Maritime Approaches to the United States. From May 2015 through October 2016, Mr. Smith performed duties as the Assistant Secretary for Strategy, Plans, Analysis and Risk with oversight of the Department's strategy, analysis, planning, and integration Processes. Mr. Smith has extensive executive, managerial, and leadership experience in the delivery and operation of large, complex water resource solutions. He coordinated nationally significant response events such as Hurricane Sandy in 2012, Mississippi and Missouri River flooding in 2011, and international contingency operations in Afghanistan, Iraq, Thailand, Pakistan, and Australia. As Commander of the Army Corps of Engineers Memphis District, he guided delivery of engineer programs projects, and services for flood risk management, navigation, environmental stewardship, and emergency operations for a six state region along the lower Mississippi River.

Mr. Smith served as the Chief of the Army Initiatives Group for the Army's senior operations officer at the Pentagon during the peak of the Army's war efforts in Iraq. He is a combat veteran and commanded the lead Army combat engineer battalion in the attack to Baghdad in 2003.
